Message.

The Church: "the called-out ones". We, the Church, have been called out of darkness into the light. We stand upon the revelation that He is the Christ, the Promised One, the Redeemer. The Church is unstoppable, because it is *His* Church, called to carry out *His* plan. We are called to bring glory to God and serve His purpose.

Self-Reflection.

It's difficult to not allow worldly influences to affect our understanding of the Church and what its suppose to be and do. But one of BCC's core values is "We Start with Scripture".

- According to Scripture, who is the Church?
- What is the Church called to do?

Looking at 1 Corinthians 12:18-20, consider your gifts.

- What role have you been given to play in the Church?
- What about outside of the Church? What role have you been given to play in growing God's Kingdom in your city, in your neighborhood, in your household?

How will you practically anchor your thoughts, beliefs, and actions to your answer to Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?"
